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Mobile Phone Case Decision Could Yield Duty Savings



Mobile Phone Case Decision From the CIT Could Yield Significant Savings for Importers

In a decision with potentially far-reaching impact for importers, the Court of International Trade recently held that certain plastic protective cases for mobile phones, tablets and similar electronic devices were not classifiable as containers in HTSUS heading 4202, at a hefty 20% duty rate. Rather, the cases were properly classified as articles of plastic under Heading 3925, with a significantly lower rate of 5.3%.

The court held that although the cases are similar to containers, since they provide protection, they neither organize nor store, and they provide only minimal carrying functionality. Furthermore, unlike the containers of Heading 4202, the cases at issue allow the electronic devices they enclose to remain fully functional. Thus, the court concluded that the cases were not classifiable as "similar containers" to those listed under Heading 4202.

Consequently, importers of similar cases may be entitled to refunds and/or have the ability to reclassify their cases to achieve the lower duty rate.
